

Suggested Answers

Please note that answers may vary, here are suggested answers for the above questions

- 1. European settles- evil, night dwellers; Native Americans- Respected for being fellow hunters
- 2. Create large enclosed area for captive wolves that were familiar with people
- 3. Lick its muzzle, Lower the tail & heads, Whining, Show undersides
- 4. Cooperation to sure food, Coordinate strategy to catch prey
- 5. Eyes alert, Patrols territory, Held tail high, Shows confidence, Decides who eats and when by showing dominance with growling
- 6. Gray
- 7. Lowest ranking members of pack
- 8. Submission to ensure harmony, Patrol and protect territory
- 9. Narrow chests to plow through deep drifts, long legs to prevent bogging down, double layer of guard hairs to prevent snow from melting from body heat
